

Oak Island Treasure Hunter Tells Students Of His Search

CHESTER — Mr. and Mrs. Robert Dunfield visited the Chester Municipal High School to present a plaque to the winning basketball team, and were also interviewed before an assembly of 500 pupils at the school, concerning Mr. Dunfield's explorations on Oak Island. The interview was conducted by Mr. Roland Feltmate who represented the teachers and pupils.

Mr. Dunfield outlined his recent explorations on the island and described what has been discovered. He told of recent setbacks which have kept him on the island longer than he had intended to stay.

When asked about how she feels about her husband's search for the supposedly buried treasure, Mrs. Dunfield said "I am all for it." Mrs. Dunfield also replied to a question of how she liked Nova Scotia by saying "I think it's beautiful." She also had a comment on the people of Nova Scotia, and used an example to illustrate her point. "We were here one week and the neighbors brought us cakes and turkey, as well as paying frequent visits. When we were living in Los Angeles we didn't even know our next door neighbor."

Mr. Dunfield was asked if he knew just where the treasure was on Oak Island. He replied by using an old Newfoundland phrase: "We looked for the money pit in one place and 'there she was, gone!'"

After the interview the Dunfields presented the Chester girls basketball team with the Dunfield Shield which was won at the first "Dunfield Invitational Basketball Tournament," held at the school earlier this year.
